“Mason calls for Cammarano and Schaffer to resign immediately”

Hoboken NJ, - Today Councilwoman Beth Mason released the following statement regarding Hoboken Mayor Peter Cammarano and former Councilman and North Hudson Sewerage Authority Commissioner Michael Schaffer:

“Like many residents I am shocked by the allegations levied against Mayor Cammarano. As someone who has always advocated for open, inclusive, and transparent government, I believe it is in the best interests of the people of Hoboken for Mayor Cammarano to resign his office immediately. While Mayor Cammarano is entitled to his day in court, his refusal to step down is both disturbing and arrogant. The people of Hoboken are demanding answers, and while it is not in the best interest of Mr. Cammarano’s legal defense to publicly discuss these allegations, the people are entitled to an open and transparent dialog with their elected officials at all times. Because of the serious allegations he faces, Mayor Cammarano’s ability to serve as Mayor without distraction and doubt has clearly been compromised.”

“It is also in the best interest of the people of Hoboken for North Hudson Sewerage Authority Commissioner Michael Schaffer to resign immediately. The North Hudson Sewerage Authority is in the process of helping our city remedy its flooding problem and our commissioner must provide 100% of his attention to that task. This is clearly impossible for Michael Schaffer to do.”
