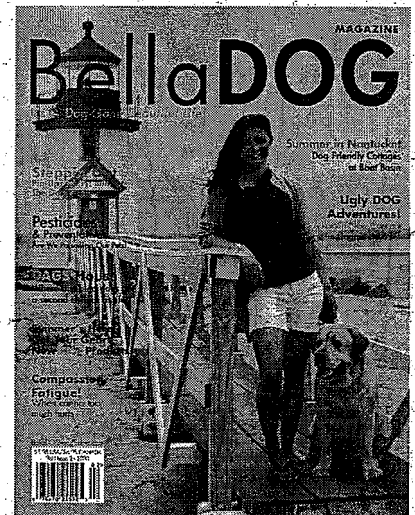
We're proud Hoboken was recently named the #1 most dog-friendly city in the country. Let's make sure it's a place all of us can continue to enjoy.

Hoboken Named #1 Most Dog-Friendly City (2011)



Please take note of the laws below that will be enforced.

SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 93

93-2: All dogs of licensing age (7 months of age or possessing a permanent set of teeth) kept in Hoboken must have a current Hoboken Health Department license. The registration tag must be securely attached to the dog's collar or harness at all times.

93-15: For the purposes of urination and defecation, all dogs must be curbed.

93-16: No dog may soil, defecate or deposit any droppings or fecal matter unless said droppings or fecal matter are removed by the person controlling the dog.

93-20 A.: All dogs must be securely confined and controlled by an adequate leash, no more than six (6) feet in length.

93-20 B.: Dogs shall be permitted only upon the paved areas of the Designated Waterfront Walkway, so long as the dog is safely confined and controlled by an adequate leash no more than six (6) feet in length. No dog shall be permitted on any grass, gravel or unpaved area of the Designated Waterfront Walkway.

93-22: No dogs are permitted in any public park in the City of Hoboken except to bring directly to and directly from a city dog run, without diversion, in any public park.
